INTERNSHIP INFORMATION

Thank you for your interest in the West Virginia Writers, Inc. Summer Writing Conference internship! West Virginia Writers, Inc. is the largest non-profit writers resource and service organization serving literary interests in West Virginia. In 2017, we will celebrate over 40 years of service to our members!

Our Annual Writers Conference is held the second weekend in June at Cedar Lakes Conference Center in Ripley, WV. This year's conference dates are June 10-12, 2016. Interns should plan to arrive the night before, on Thursday, June 9 (unless other arrangements have been made in advance), in order to complete check-in, meet conference planners, and assist with set-up. After you've checked into your room, please meet with Stacy Tritt, WV Writers 1st Vice President and Intern Wrangler, in the Holt Lodge Conference Room for further instruction.

Interns have a wonderful opportunity to work one-on-one with literary talent from across the state and the nation. Our Annual Writers Conference is held in a casual setting with encouraging, inspirational instructors and the warm, friendly members of WV Writers, providing interns with the chance to network, gain one-on-one advice, and learn from published poets, authors, and literary agents. Informal, informative discussions abound!

The WV Writers Annual Writers Conference includes three days of writing workshops in all genres, including poetry, fiction, non-fiction, children's writing, and more. Interns will work together to choose which workshops they will attend while maintaining coverage of the Assembly Hall stations (including registration and bookstore). We select a minimum of four interns each year who work alongside conference planners and presenters, making sure everyone can attend their fair share of workshops.

Interns may also participate in the People's Choice competitions for both Prose and Poetry, by bringing a poem or short (3-minute) piece of prose to read aloud. Interns may also participate in the Writers' Wall writing display and competition, by bringing a one-page poem or prose piece to display on the wall. Prizes in each of these competitions are awarded by popular vote. (Names should not be affixed to Writers' Wall contest submissions.)

The three-day event also includes many social activities, including nightly entertainment (open mic, live music, etc.) and a nightly bonfire, rain permitting. All meals, with the exception of the Saturday night Awards Banquet, are informal, allowing ample time for discussions with other writers, poets, and instructors.

Dress for the Conference is camp-style casual. Jeans, shorts, tee-shirts, and sweatshirts are common. Wear comfortable shoes for walking. Be sure to pack sweaters for cool nights by the bonfire. Layering is recommended, as classroom temperatures vary. Attire for the Saturday night Awards Banquet is less informal, with business attire (slacks, dresses, polo shirts, and some ties) prevailing.

Award of Internship:

Internships will be awarded based on quality and number of submissions received. Internship awards will be announced via email and/or telephone no later than Monday, May 23, 2016. Interns must accept or reject award offer no later than Monday, May 30, 2016.

Alternate "Runner-Up" awards may be offered to qualified applicants. Runner-up intern awards will include free conference registration and one year's membership to West Virginia Writers, Inc. Room and board will not be included for runner-up awards, and must be paid by the student or University. Universities are also encouraged to offer and award their own student-writer internships to the WV Writers Annual Spring Conference at University expense.

- Provide lodging for intern for up to three (3) nights at Cedar Lakes Conference Center in Ripley, WV, (Thursday, Friday, and Saturday nights).
- Provide meals for intern, (breakfast, lunch, and dinner, including Saturday's Awards Banquet Dinner), during the period of the WVW Annual Writers Conference (Thursday evening-Sunday afternoon).
- Waive conference registration/attendance fee of \$145.00.

West Virginia Writers, Inc. (WVW) Responsibilities to Runner-up Internship Recipient:

- Waive conference registration/attendance fee of \$145.00.
- One (1) year free membership in West Virginia Writers, Inc., valid July 1, 2016 June 30, 2017.

Intern and Runner-Up Intern Responsibilities:

- Arrive no later than Thursday evening at 6:00 pm. (In some instances, alternate arrangements can be made for interns to arrive by Friday morning at 9:00 am, should a Thursday night arrival be impossible.)
- Attend Thursday night conference set-up planning in Holt Lodge Conference Room.
- Assist with set-up and tear-down of booths and tables in Assembly Hall.
- Assist conference leaders with various duties as requested, including, but not limited to, presentation of awards at banquet, silent auction, conference registration assistance, assistant bookstore clerk, and registration of poetry and prose contestants.
- Assist workshop presenters/authors with various duties as requested, such as photocopying, and passing out workshop materials.
- Transportation to and from Conference. (Carpooling may be arranged with a WVW member from your area, but is not guaranteed.)
